

Dear Friends in Christ,

This past year, our diocese actively participated in the National Eucharistic Revival that is reinvigorating the faithful and strengthening our collective capacity as missionary disciples of Jesus. The blessing of our

Eucharistic Congress on October 28, 2023, was a day full of hope and joy as 5,000 people gathered at the Bank of Springfield Convention Center to celebrate the source and summit of our Catholic faith, the Holy Eucharist.

The United States Catholic Conference of Bishops (USCCB) has published a manual to provide specific guidance on how parishes can imbed this revival spirit within their local congregations. As I present this Annual Report for Catholic Charities, I am reminded of one of the "four invitations" outlined in this publication. The first part of Invitation #4 speaks to reaching out to those in our inner circles who may have fallen away from the Church and inviting them to come back to Sunday Mass and parish life.

The second part of this invitation encourages us to consider how we can identify and accompany those in need and on the margins. As part of the Mystical Body of Christ, Catholics all over the country can become the hands and feet of Jesus to bring his Good News to the mission field of their neighborhood and parish. The Church reminds us that "the Eucharist commits us to the poor" (CCC, no. 1397). "A Eucharist which does not pass over into the concrete practice of love is intrinsically fragmented" (Pope Benedict XVI, Deus caritas est, no. 14).

Through the work of the Catholic Charities ministry, we respond to the Lord's great commission to "go and make disciples" by the faithful witness of our lives—by reaching out to the lost, the least, and the last. Catholic Charities is an excellent opportunity to foster this missionary objective. As you read this report, I ask you to consider supporting, or increasing your support, for Catholic Charities through volunteerism, donations, or prayers.

It is a pleasure for me to present the 2023 Annual Report for Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois. This coming March will mark my 25-year anniversary as the Executive Director of this blessed organization. It's hard not to get a

little nostalgic. While I have many stories and reflections, the greatest delight has been the people I have met along the way, across this diocese and beyond. There are so many wonderful communities throughout our 28 counties and so many incredible people who live in them! Our dedicated staff, volunteers, boards, and donors come from all over and band together to serve our brothers and sisters most in need with the love and mercy of our Savior. It has been such an unbelievable honor and privilege to have worked alongside so many compassionate and servant people.

In October of 2023, I attended the Eucharistic Congress sponsored by our diocese. Experiencing the joy of celebrating the Eucharist with 5,000 fellow Catholics on this day was incredible! At the Catholic Marketplace, we hosted a booth to provide information about the long history and programs of Catholic Charities. I had the opportunity to see quite a few "old friends" from around the diocese and a chance to talk to many people about our important ministry of the Church.

The most profound experience from working at the Catholic Charities booth was meeting several people who told me, unsolicited, what Catholic Charities meant to them in their lives. One woman tearfully retold the story of her own adoption through Catholic Charities. She said she could not have had more loving parents than the couple who adopted her. Another told me that her aunt often spoke fondly of her childhood growing up at the Catholic Children's Home in Alton. Later, a man expressed how Catholic Charities was there for his cousin when he was "down and out," helping him with food, rent, and utility assistance. Today his cousin is back on his feet, working and raising a family. These powerful testimonies reinvigorated and reinforced my belief in the Mission of Catholic Charities and the power of God's love.

As you read this report, I ask you to remember that it's not just about the total number of people we serve every year. Each number is a human person; a child of God with a story of their own about how Catholic Charities helped them in their time of need. Thank you for your support of our efforts.

Higher Love Shown Through the Agape Project



Somewhere in the Effingham area or a neighboring community, there is a child at risk, a breadwinner out of work, or a senior in need of a helping hand. Whether it be financial, material, emotional, or spiritual support, Effingham Catholic Charities has many programs designed to assist and provide for these families and

individuals in need. Since 1981, Effingham Catholic Charities has faithfully served the people of Clark, Crawford, Cumberland, Effingham, Fayette, and Jasper counties through a broad range of programs and services. This year, the community gave back in a big way!

In early 2023, the Effingham Catholic Charities Advisory Board announced a special capital campaign, the Agape Project. This campaign aimed to raise funds to ensure safe parking and walkways, provide cost-efficient heating and cooling and renovate the on site food pantry to provide a more dignified and spacious environment for clients. In Christianity, agape is the highest form of love, a transcendent sacrificial love that persists regardless of circumstances. True to this ideal, the Agape Project committee,

under the leadership of Beth Lindvahl, succeeded in meeting its \$600,000 fundraising goal in just four short months. In fact, benchmarks were met early enough in the campaign to allow the HVAC systems work to be completed in time to provide relief from the summer hear. The next project in the works funded by the Agape Project, slated for completion in 2024, will be the renovation of the on site food pantry.

Sister Carol Beckermann, Area Director for Effingham Catholic Charities, said that the new food pantry will provide families with a more dignified environment when seeking assistance.

Hundreds of families are served at the food pantry every year. "The renovation design will provide more open space to allow people an opportunity to "shop" for food items as opposed to the more impersonal "assembly line" type of process," stated Sr. Carol. "It will create a more interactive space where people can feel relaxed and dignified and where we can connect with our families on a deeper, more personal level."

The Agape Project is just another example of the generosity and compassion of our donors, volunteers, and the campaign committee. The overwhelming generosity and support not only surpassed expectations but created a powerful ripple of compassion that uplifts and transforms lives. Thank you for helping us continue to foster a legacy of love and support for those in need!

Decatur Highlights

The Decatur Area Office and its programs had another paramount year! The Meals on Wheels program continues to grow exponentially, fostering new relationships in the community, supporters, and clients who are grateful for the service. The food pantry continues to actively address food insecurity in Macon County and its surrounding areas, adding an additional Mobile Pantry delivery site, The "Together, We Can End Hunger Food Drive" partnership with three other social service agencies raised critical funds for our hunger relief efforts. The 4 Seasons Resale Store has experienced record donations and sales numbers this year!

The ElderCare options and Elderly Guardianship programs continue to provide necessary advocacy services to those seeking assistance. Our dedicated guardianship team remains the leader in guardianship services in Macon County.

Our HealthConnect program, in partnership with HSHS St. Mary's, continues to assist with increasing self-sufficiency support by creating person-centered plans that address all determinants of health, not just medical support.

The Matter of Balance and Bingocize team expanded its programs to surrounding counties, increasing outreach to more seniors. The Faith In Action program hired a new coordinator, Tara Voorhees, who is focused on volunteer recruitment and senior engagement.

Catholic Children's Home Highlights

The Catholic Children's Home in Alton continues to care for children with emotional and behavioral challenges, including autism. The Center to Heal and Achieve at CCH is a special education day school providing children from surrounding school districts the opportunity to succeed in the classroom. The students receive specialized academic, therapeutic and behavior intervention services.

In addition to the special day school, CCH operates a residential program (McNicholas Home), a transitional living program (L.I.F.T.), and an independent living program (L.I.F.T.-Next Step) serving youth ages 11 to 18 in the McNicholas Home and ages 17 to 21 in the L.I.F.T. Program. The Catholic Children's Home currently serves 57 children.

With the return of indoor dining, guests can enjoy a hot meal, fellowship, and socialize in a warm, positive environment every day, 365 days a year. Thanks to the contributions of many generous

donors, we provided 40 Easter baskets to children visiting the Breadline in the Spring. Our Souper Bowl and Souper Friday semi-annual fundraisers were both huge hits, as usual! The community came through in 2023, providing us with essential funding and food. We received a grant from the Illinois Credit Union League. Over the course of the year, the employees of Lowes on North Dirksen and Big Red's Bait Shop hosted food drives for our benefit. The Figueras family showed their support, hosting the Esper Figueras Memorial Golf Outing, which raised nearly \$8,000 for the Breadline! The St. John's Breadline served 157,517 meals to the most vulnerable in our community. The Eisenberg Pantry located inside St. John's Breadline provided non-perishable food items and toiletry items to our guests.

2023 PROGRAMS

Catholic Charities Legal Services

This community-based, quality legal services program helps people with little to no income in obtaining pro bono legal assistance in civil matters from area lawyers in specialized fields.

Catholic Children's Home

The Alton-based home provides special education and therapeutic services for students ages 5-18 as well as residential and independant living programs for boys ages 11-21. Educational services include programming tailored to children with autism.

Crisis Assistance

We provide emergency financial assistance for rent, utilities, and transportation, as well as providing basic necessities including diapers or hygiene products.

Education and Advocacy

Catholic Charities partners with local community agencies to make referrals for services not offered by Catholic Charities.

Eldercare Options

Assesses, counsels, and determines the need for guardianship for the alleged disabled adults who can no longer make sound judgments on their own behalf. We also strive to find alternative to guardianship and secure sound decision makers on behalf of the disabled adults.

Elderly Guardianship

We assume legal guardianship of seniors and provide decision making and advocacy for elderly adults who lack the ability to make proper judgments concerning their health, well-being, and safety.

Faith in Action

Volunteers are matched with homebound seniors, age 55 and older, in Macon County to provide companionship and non-medical assistance. Faith in Action is to help seniors maintain an independent lifestyle in their own homes.

Food Pantries

Our staff serves the nutritional needs of families by helping with immediate problems and searching for future solutions. Donations of food, time, and money are necessary to respond to local hunger.

Health Connect

Health Connect is a comprehensive intervention program that works with clients who have a high number of hospital emergency room readmissions due to poor health, self-management skills, lack of resources or other social and emotional challenges.

Intact Family Services

This program's goal is to keep troubled families together by offering them intense case management and education in parenting and linking them with related services in their communities. This program is referral based only from DCFS.

Meals on Wheels

Lunches are delivered on weekdays by caring volunteers to homebound seniors in Decatur and Macon County. Meals on Wheels served 97,954 meals in the 2023 fiscal year.

Meals on Wheels Congregate

The Meals on Wheels Congregate program is designed for older adults to eat a nutritious meal and socialize with friends. The program is for seniors 60 years of age and older to enjoy a hot, healthy lunch served in a group setting. This program routinely schedules special activities and speakers.

MedAssist

A prescription medicine assistance program that aids clients with securing immediate or long-term medications at free or substantially reduced costs. The following services also fall under our MedAssist program: Senior Health Insurance Program, Marketplace Certified Application Sites, Immediate Meds, the Dental Voucher Program, and Medical Equipment Loan Program. These specific program offerings vary by site.

Mobile Food Pantry

Through this rural hunger relief effort, seven refrigerated trucks deliver food to pre-registered individuals and families in small communities throughout the Springfield Diocese.

Post-Adoption Services

The Post Adoption program is designed to support and strengthen the lives of adoptive parents, adult adopted persons and birth parents by providing compassionate profiles, searches and intermediary services.

Professional Counseling Solutions

Our therapists offer professional, compassionate services to individuals, couples and families striving for emotional wellness. We also provide counseling to foster children, students and women in crisis pregnancies.

Ramblin' Rose

The Ramblin' Rose Bus, a ministry sponsored by Effingham Catholic Charities, will travel to towns in the seven-county area this summer to deliver school supplies and clothing. The program provides assistance to families with limited financial means, who qualify for free or reduced school lunches.

Resale Stores

Our stores are ideal places to find gently worn clothing, housewares and furniture at nominal costs, and vouchers are available to provide items free of charge to families in need. Volunteers and community donations help keep our stores going strong.

St. Anne Residence

A beautiful 23-unit apartment community in Beardstown for low-income seniors needing a safe, warm place to call home. The St. Anne Residence opened in 2005.


St. John's Breadline




